

President's Message—

Reminder —our meetings are now being held on the 2nd Tuesday of the month.

THIS IS IMPORTANT: Again I am asking you to take an interest in this because it is important to the bikers that visit our state as well as us. There is a plan to resurface the Blue Ridge Parkway with "chip seal." This is a terrible surface for motorcycle riding, so we need you to contact your US Senator and US Representative and tell them we are NOT ok with this. I have put a sample letter in this newsletter that you can use as a guide. Please contact your representative concerning this very important issue. To contact your representative, go to www.house.gov and www.senate.gov. It's very simple, so take the time to make your concerns known. We all love to ride the Parkway and we certainly don't need our brothers and sisters getting hurt on a surface that is not compatible with motorcycles. It doesn't matter if you live in NC or not, please contact your Representatives because this will be a problem for all of us if this succeeds.

I've thought a lot about what we should say to bikers or people that love motorcycles about why they should belong to the CBA and I'm sure you have also. It's hard to make people understand what we do although we know what we are working for. Although our organization is not "life altering" and we are not going to cure an illness or do some of the other things that charitable organizations do, BUT we are a very important organization. MRO groups like ours can make riding that bike of yours safer, more enjoyable and hopefully in the future—without being profiled. We work hard to get people in cars to see us and understand what distractive driving can do to us or our family who might be on the bike with us. If you remember, I put something in the February newsletter that James Buckner said at our State Meeting. If we had every biker in NC as members in the CBA, there would be nothing we couldn't accomplish. And that is the honest truth because those folks listen to numbers. I'm asking you to go out and talk to your friends about joining the CBA. There is Gaston, other chapters across the state and at-large memberships. We just want you to be active in recruiting people to a group that will look after your / their concerns. And by the way, what are your concerns? We work on an agenda every year, so if you are concerned about something that needs to be addressed, please let one of our officers know.

I keep thinking that Mother Nature is going to slap us again with winter weather. We have been spoiled this past month with unseasonable good riding weather. I love the seasons, but as Peewee & I get older, we find it's a lot more fun to ride when it's 65+. Sometimes we can attend but maybe not contribute money to the event. Well folks that is perfectly all right in my book. I would rather see your face and not contribute than not see you. And it's a joy for me because we are not able to get out as much as we would like to, so I'm looking forward to seeing you a bunch this month! Now let's hope Peewee cooperates and stays healthy. lol

SAMPLE LETTER TO YOUR US SENATER AND US HOUSE REPRESENTATIVE:

Dear Senator	
(or Dear Representative)):

I am writing to express my dissatisfaction with an upcoming road project on the Blue Ridge Parkway in North Carolina. It seems that the plan is to use a chip seal method to resurface 150 miles of the parkway in NC. This is not a good idea for many reasons. Using this method will certainly cause a spike in the accident/ injury/fatality rates among motorcyclists. When motorcyclist finds that the road is not safe, there will be a corresponding decrease in the tourism dollars that come into the area. And motorcyclists do bring a lot of tourism dollars into that area. The savings in maintenance dollars will be offset by the loss of dollars in that industry. Please take action to amend this project to a safer method. I would be very willing to provide you reasons why this is not a good idea, should you wish more information.


Vice President's Message-







Then send them an email requesting that they co-sponsor the bills that we are supporting.

The helmet freedom of choice bills are HB91 and SB66. These are identical bills The equal access bill is HB28.

Eagles and Canaries What is it with eagles? For many decades now the eagle has been associated with bikers and motorcycles. They're embroidered on our patches, painted on our bikes, printed on our shirts and inked on our bodies. Sharp beaks, razor talons, fierce eyes, feathers flaring—they're everywhere we look and have become as iconic as the bar and shield of Harley-Davidson, the swooping letters of the Triumph logo or the seemingly-obligatory wet t-shirt contest at a biker rally.

But why the eagle? Sure, there's the obvious reason that the bald eagle is our national bird and appears on everything from our money to the Great Seal of the United States. There's the long-running association going back to the Roman Empire of the bird as a symbol of power. And even I'll admit that the eagle sure looks a lot more intimidating than, say, the tufted titmouse. I wonder though, if we motorcyclists picked the wrong winged critter to be our flying mascot. Perhaps it's time to consider another bird for the eagle's lofty perch.

I propose to you, my fellow riders, a possible replacement: the lowly canary. The diminutive yellow bird has long been considered a sentinel species, an animal used to detect threats to humans by providing advance warning of danger.
