#### President's Message-

We would like to know what you would like to see or hear at the meetings. Do you want a speaker? And if you do want informative speakers—on what subjects? How about a short meeting with a lot of fellowship afterwards? The officers of this chapter give a lot of their time, hard work and energy to this organization, so you guys could at least give an hour once a month to support them at the general meeting. I know meetings are usually boring but you usually sit longer in a doctor's or dentist's office. Seriously we need your support and input. Did you get to ride on our Freedom Ride? If not you missed a really good ride and great day. We rode about 150 miles round trip to a Revolutionary War Battlefield in SC. If you have never ridden in a group with road guards, just pay attention to what the more experienced riders do and everything will work out great. If you see a rider raise his/her hand with 1 finger pointed up—that means move to the right now—not later. We are looking out for your safety and also the safety of our road guards.

Our Easter Egg Hunt was a HUGE success and without much help from our members. What few members were there, did an awesome job. We had a big crowd of kids and their parents who played games, karaoke, and hunted nearly 800 eggs filled with toys, candy and money. I was disappointed that more of our members didn't help or attend with their kids and grandkids but we had a good day anyway. We want to make this something to build on for our biker family so we hope you will participate in our next family event. A good number of our members have been requesting that we do a family day every couple of months. With the success that we had, we are going to try just that, so if you are one of those members—we sincerely hope you will attend because it was your suggestion that got the ball rolling.

#### **VICE-PRESIDENT'S CORNER -**

Most parts of the country are already feeling some heat in the 2017 riding season—lucky them! But even as we talk about the best strategies and types of gear for riding in hot weather, while staying relatively protected from the hazards of the road, it's also important to keep in mind other, more subtle hazards to your health. Make no mistake, no matter how tough you are, no matter how experienced a rider, no matter how good your physical condition is, if you don't respect the heat, it will knock you on your ass. We're not Doctors, but here are some tips we use for surviving a motorcycle tour through the summer heat:

Watch very carefully for signs of Heat Exhaustion and Heat Stroke. Your body will send you signals that it's having trouble with the heat, which can include cramps, nausea, headaches, extreme fatigue, flushed or pale skin, dizziness, and heavy sweating. Left unchecked, you can develop Heat Exhaustion, which is a form of mild shock. If you're feeling

these symptoms, it's time to pull over, rehydrate, rest and recover for as long as it takes. Don't be in a rush to get back on the bike – sometimes a rider doesn't want to inconvenience their friends by holding things up. How long do you think a trip to the hospital will hold up the ride?


Bring more water than you think you'll need. Water is vital for keeping the body cool, but it also is necessary for digestion, for flushing toxins out of your body, and for lubricating your joints. It also cushions your organs and tissues, so when you get dehydrated, your body just won't work properly, things will start to shut down, and you'll physically crash.

Include stops on your route where you can cool off. One of the best ways to rejuvenate yourself is by getting out of the heat, into a cooler environment. You meet interesting people in rural convenience stores, and many have large ice freezers outside. We place our helmets in the freezers while we go inside for a cool drink. A quick stop can enable you to ride another 45 minutes even in the worst heat, so plan your ride along roads that have services and conveniences no more than 1/2 hour apart.

*Dress properly and keep your skin covered.* Seems like simple, advice, but it's amazing how many people don't follow it. Any areas of skin that are exposed will be much harder to cool, as the sweat will evaporate from the air rushing over it at speed. This means you'll dehydrate faster. Remember ride for the slide not the ride.




