Master Sergeant at Arms/Road Captain (Brian) – Currently working on routes for some Sunday rides. One of the rides will be to the Fred Sims Chapel – watch for more details. This is the outdoor chapel that has the amazing view with the cross.

Polar Bear Run shirts are \$15 each and the proceeds from these shirts is being donated to St. Jude's (Mickey's family chose the charity) so please buy a shirt.

Old Business –

CBA/ABATE of NC is responsible for volunteers to work. We voted to not spend over \$1200 to send 2 people. This covers gas, hotel for 3 nights, and registration.

Hello everyone,

Every month part of being a CBA officer is writing a article for our newsletter.. Sometimes, yes EVEN ME struggles to find something to write about.. My mind wonders in so many directions.. Getting some not so good news about My Daddy was so not what I wanted to hear today, tomorrow or any day.. I walked to the mailbox as I do every day, pulling out a returned Father's Day card that I sent to my Daddy. Immediately pulling the Postal sticker off that said (Return to sender, Attempted - Not known, Unable to Forward, Return to Sender)..Yes, I had the right address. So what's happened. I called couldn't get him. Texted his wife to have him call me. He did, his voice was weak. He got her on the phone putting it on speaker. First I asked what's up with the card being returned. They had moved from Charleston SC to Savannah GA in MAY!! And no one bothered to tell me! Little did I know.

A lot has went on since December last year. He was taking Ambien for sleep..Well I know personally what crazy things people do when taking Ambien, as I was on it many years ago for deprived sleep. Well Daddy gets up goes out the door at 2 am in his jockeys, wonders 3 blocks down the road, finds a porch with some pillows to cover himself to try and get warm, it was 22 degrees!!! Sets the homeowners alarm off, police and ambulance arrive, take him to the hospital where he had frost bite toes, very low blood pressure and had a stroke. "They kept this from me."

In May they were visiting her children and grandchildren in Savannah, he has another bout with very low blood pressure among other things now diagnosed with dementia, hospital stay 8 days!! "They kept this from me."

When he was released they go look at a house in Savannah, (did I say this house has 3 bedrooms, 3 bathrooms) but it's just in one level! And just the 2 of them. Buy it! Go back to Charleston to pack. Sell their house within a few days. I'm just finding this all out. After all he's 91 years old. A Private person.. She says he didn't want me to know or to worry . THAT'S MY DADDY your talking about—I have a right to know.. Their life is forever gonna change. He walks with a walker now, security is installed to the house, so he can't go on another escape.

Anyone who knows me, knows I'm a Daddy's girl!!

After this phone call, I cried all day.. Knowing that day is going to come.. How do you prepare yourself for dementia to set in where the phone calls are less and for one day not knowing me. And the day the inevitable comes?

I had planned on a visit soon..Their taking one day at a time ..SHE said, will see~

Seriously, this is My Daddy.

If it's not to much to ask PLEASE send up some prayer's..

Your probably saying.. (what does any of this have to do with CBA or motorcycles?)

Nothing...it's just another chapter of my life. Sometimes we take life for granite, We are so not promised tomorrow. Hug your family and friends every chance you get because in this world we live in it could be your last one.

I'll leave you with this to ponder...

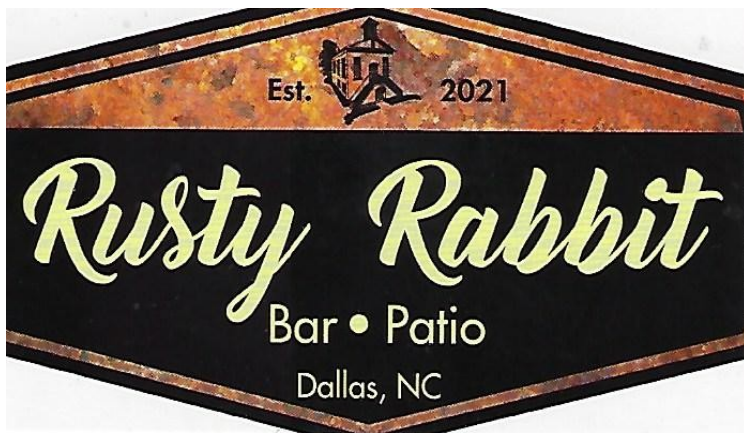

2021 State CBA Legislative Agenda

Our main focus for the 2021 long session will be -

Anti-Profiling

Equal Access to parking facilities built with taxpayer funds – we will reintroduce this bill

Grass clippings on the roadways

We will monitor legislation for anything that may come up regarding motorcyclists and we will be supportive of the groups pursuing "Hands free NC" legislation. We will monitor lane filtering/splitting in the states where legislation has been passed.

MRF High Priority 2021 Legislative Agenda

Profiling: Continue pursuit of the House anti-profiling resolution mirroring the Senate version that passed unanimously. Build momentum for inclusion of anti-profiling language in other legislation.

Renewable Fuels: Advocate for targeted changes to the Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS).

Autonomous Vehicles: Advocate and monitor any legislation or regulations related to motorcycles concerning connected and autonomous vehicles.

Emission Regulations: Engage the EPA & Congress on any activity related to motorcycle emission regulations.

Definition of a Motorcycle: Educate policymakers and advocate for change to current definition, that better reflects the current two- and three-wheel motorcycle landscape.

Crash Avoidance: Continue to promote the theme of crash avoidance versus safer crashing urging NHTSA and the DOT to focus on crash prevention and rider education.

Helmet Laws: Oppose any mandatory federal helmet, apparel or conspicuity standards.

Black Box: Pursue legislative language that any collected or available vehicle data is the property of the consumer and in which the consumer has the choice to opt-out of having their personal data communicated to interested parties.

Surface Transportation Reauthorization (Highway Bill): Advocate and pursue legislative efforts that impact motorcyclists in the Highway Bill, now set to expire in 2021.



Who We Are is Who We Were

(Reprinted from The Masterlink—August 2021)

We understand now, we've been made to understand, and to embrace the understanding that who we are is who we were. – John Quincy Adams

When President Adams spoke those words, he was arguing before the United States Supreme Court, long after his time in the White House had passed. The case being heard was to determine the fate of insurrectionists aboard the Spanish slave ship 'Amistad' in 1839. The insurrectionists were captive Africans, being transported to the United States to be sold as slaves.

Arguing in favor of freeing the Africans, Adams referenced the Declaration of Independence, which reads in part:

'We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.--That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed....




When Adams said 'who we are is who we were' he was talking about the importance of looking back into our past, remembering what is really important to us as Americans. While some people will argue that the founding principles laid out in the Declaration of Independence and the U.S. Constitution and are no longer valid, that the changing nature of our world precludes any lasting adherence, many of us believe those principles are as valid and inviolate today as they ever were.

If you've seen the film 'Amistad' or if you know the story, you know that Adams and the other members of the legal team were successful in obtaining the freedom of the Africans. No small feat considering the political machinery of the day.

That understanding of 'who we are is who we were' will always be relevant when we're faced with those who would take away our freedom in the belief that government, not the governed, should decide what is best for the people.

In the motorcyclists' rights movement, our core values haven't changed. For more than fifty years we have remained true to our founding principles. Some people think of us only as 'the helmet law people', and while we are as opposed to mandatory helmet laws as we have ever been, we are so much more than that. We work with like-minded elected officials and governmental agencies to promote motorcycling. Since the inception of motorcycle safety training, motorcyclists' rights organizations have been among the strongest proponents of rider education and safety programs. We fight unfair insurance provisions targeting motorcycling. We stand up for motorcycling businesses and our right to safely modify our machines. We never stop monitoring state and federal legislation for any bill that affects motorcyclists, and we always take a principled stand, regardless of who we're going up against. And we win. The Motorcycle Riders Foundation, alongside our partner organizations, those who continue working to preserve and protect motorcycling, will always remember; 'Who we are is who we were'.

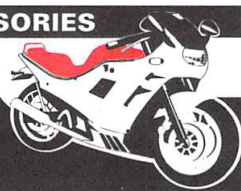

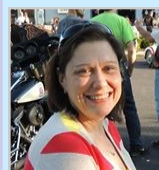

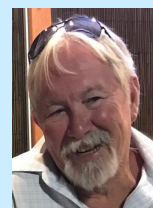
